BRIGHTSPACE

Brightspace is the platform where you register for a course, view all the past courses that you have registered, receive the announcements from Professors, access all the assignments and material related to your courses and also submit your graded assignments. You also register your own groups for any group assignments for any particular course, if required.

MY TIMETABLE

This is where you can access the Timetable of all the courses. Note that you don't have to be registered for a course to see its timetable. Visit the My Timetable link given below and make sure to Log In at the top right corner. Click on "Add Timetable" followed by "Course". Search for the course of your choice and click on "Add Timetables". Once added, you can see their Timetable on your MyTUDelft App. Link to My Timetable: https://mytimetable.tudelft.nl/

Pro Tip: You also want to add the Programme of Study. This way, you can see those extra sessions that you may want to attend such as Module/Track info sessions. Follow the same procedure as above, and instead of adding a "Course", choose to add "Programme of Study", followed by "CEG Master Civil Engineering YI (2024/2025)". Then choose your preferred track.

MY TU DELFT APP & BRIGHTSPACE PULSE APP

These apps are available on the Play Store & App Store. MyTUDelft app is your go-to app for checking your timetable for the day and the classroom information. You can also register for your exam via the app, and check your grades, and study progress (no. of ECs earned). The Pulse App is a short version of Brightspace, where you can receive notifications whenever a new announcement has been posted on the course page. You can also view the slides of the courses as soon as they are uploaded onto Brightspace.

REGISTRATION FOR YOUR COURSES

Visit the Link to Brightspace. Click on the "Catalog". Then click on "Log In" at the top right corner. Then select "Browse courses". Search for the course you're interested in. Select the course and then click on "Enroll". You can then "launch" the course to see the announcements. You can then see that you've registered for this course on the "My Home" tab of Brightspace. For Quarter I, make sure you are registered for both "CEGM1000: MUDE" and "CIEM0000: Programme BASE". Sometimes, the courses only open a few days before the quarter begins! You can pin a course after which they appear on the "My Pinned Courses" tab.

Pro Tip I: You can also register for the previous year Brightspace page of the same courses. That way, you can access the material and examinations that were distributed during the previous years.

Pro Tip 2: There are also a few important pages that you might want to register and keep an eye on for some general information. The following are to name a few: Master Civil Engineering, CE Master Track Structural Engineering and Master programme Civil Engineering and Geosciences

REGISTRATION FOR YOUR EXAMS

If you're an international student then this is very important! TU Delft requires you to register for any exam. Only if you're registered for the exam, you will be allowed to take the exam. The registration for the exam typically opens 8 weeks prior to the exam (around 2^{nd} or 3^{rd} week into the Quarter). However, you can only register until 14 calendar days before the date of the examination. After this deadline, you will be placed on a waiting

list. Please note that the Professors will NOT announce during the lectures that the registration is open. It's up to you to register!

Pro Tip: Don't forget to remind your friends to register for the exams too! Always carry your TU Delft ID card for your exams. It is recommended to set up a quarterly reminder on your calendar for registration for the exams! You must also register for the resits!

HOW TO REGISTER FOR AN EXAM?

Visit the MyTUDelft website or the App. Look for the option "Enrol". Then select the option "Test". Search for your course and enrol.

Pro Tip: You should receive an email confirming your registration for the examination of the selected course.

COURSES & EUROPEAN CREDITS (EC) SYSTEM

The Modern Migration Policy Act (MoMi) is the Dutch immigration law. It requires all non-EU/EEA students with a residence permit for study at TU Delft to achieve sufficient study progress (50%) every academic year. TU Delft is obliged to monitor your study progress.

Is your study progress not sufficient? Then TU Delft must report this to the IND. Consequently, your residence permit for study may be revoked.

No matter what, **make sure you get 30 EC's by the end of your 1st Year**, unless you have a valid reason.

Your courses are actually "Modules" for the reason that they have many sub-units among them and sometimes a module can even span across 2 quarters (MUDE & Track BASE). You pass a Module only if you pass all the sub-units within the module. Only then you will see it being reflected under "Progress" tab in "MyTUDelft" App. So, you get the total credits of the Module when you pass in all the "units" inside the Module. Example: in Module AI for Structural Engineering, we have 3 Units. If you pass in Units I & 2 but fail in Unit-3, you don't get any credits for the units you have already passed (but you keep these grades for those units). You have to take the resit for Unit-3 and pass it, only then you will receive the credits for the complete AI module. Thus, be sure that you complete at least some Modules (instead of doing a little bit of everything) to be able to get the credits and at least the 30 EC.

MY STUDY PLANNING

As you know, there are 6 tracks under MSc Civil Engineering, namely, Construction Materials, Structural Engineering, Hydraulic Engineering, Hydraulic & Offshore Structures, Geotechnical Engineering and Traffic & Transport Engineering. The first quarter is common for all the tracks. But from the second quarter, the track specific courses begin. You will be asked to provide a short motivation letter for why you are interested in a particular track. This usually happens at the end of the Ist Quarter, around the October month. You will have to submit the motivation via My Study Planning website. Normally everybody gets their preferred track. But we suggest you provide a good motivation! You will also use My Study Planning for choosing your Electives and Cross-over Modules for second year, but there is a lot of time, and you will receive instructions for the same soon.

Pro Tip: You should look for the option "Civil Engineering students cohort 24/25" in the following link. This option will become visible once the process for track application begins.

COLLEGERAMA

FINDING AN INTERNSHIP/MSC THESIS

During your Msc study, there are two times at which you can arrange a collaboration with a company. In Q5, you can opt for an internship (+ an Elective) instead of taking three Electives. Secondly, you can decide to do an internship with a company for your thesis. Some companies offer topics

where you combine both the internship for Q5 and for your thesis, with 8 months of duration (2 months internship + 6 months master thesis). With an internship in a company, you gain experience & network, and you can get paid as well.

Start looking for a topic/company for your internship/thesis at least one quarter in advance, preferably even earlier. For your thesis, you should have your topic before the start of Thesis Preparation. Find a topic that you like, in a company that suits you. To make your choice, it is advisable to contact more than one company. Please note that it takes quite some time to arrange a company since you have to have contact via e-mail and attend interviews in person. Choosing something you enjoy is important since you have to work on it for quite some time.

To find possible companies, you can attend lunch lectures and other company-related activities from the master dispute, where you can get acquainted with a company and obtain a contact within the company. There are also big events on campus such as the Civil Engineering Business Days (Civiele Bedrijvendagen) in May, which provide opportunities to connect with companies.

Pro Tip : If you plan to contact the companies during the summer (July-August), you might not get immediate replies due to the holiday season.

FINDING AN MDP

In Q5, you also have the opportunity to do a group project abroad, called a 'Multidisciplinary Project' (MDP). You are free to form your own group (4-6 students) and to find your own project. To form a group, ask around to see who wants to join you on an adventure. The only requirement is that at least two master tracks should be represented in your group. To find a project, look at the TU Delft Repository through old MDP reports for some inspirations. Often, professors that have guided a MDP group in the past, still have awesome projects lying around for you! You can also contact international companies to see if they can help you.

LATEX

Do you like Programming? Then you're definitely going to like Latex which becomes very handy when you want to write reports with long Mathematical expressions, as compared to the traditional MS Word.
